PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As the weather turns warmer here in the Northern Hemisphere, our thoughts turn to the 2006 sailing season. Our friends in the Southern Hemisphere and in the southern parts of Europe and North America have been able to sail throughout the past few months.

A very successful Florida winter circuit was culminated by the recent Bacardi Cup, an event enjoyed by 92 boats from 22 countries. The Class deeply appreciates the efforts of Tito Bacardi and the Bacardi family who have hosted this event since 1927.

We have been working hard to encourage increased participation in 2006. Several districts have adopted a more focused schedule, emphasizing the District Championship and several other regional events. I hope individual fleets will try new concepts that enhance enjoyment of the sailing and camaraderie of the members.

The major events for 2006 promise to be great regattas. The Silver Star events in Annapolis and Miami take advantage of two of the best sailing venues in North America. The European silver stars in Naples and Hamburg likewise promise excellent sailing and locations with great tradition for the Star class. And of course the World's in San Francisco will be an extraordinary regatta.

This year's Silver Stars will be the first chance to try out the new formats and courses in Rule 34, as passed by the membership in December. Format "C" was successfully tried at the South American Silver Star in February. Nine races were sailed, with lengths of 5-6 miles. Everyone seemed to enjoy the shorter courses and more races. Depending on fleet size, Format B or C may be tried at other Silver Star or Blue Star events in 2006.

It is very important that all regatta organizers understand that the while the new formats permit shorter races than the traditional long Star courses, each format has a specific minimum length of legs, to ensure a fair race. The Class has always had a strong tradition of not shortening courses after starting, and this requirement continues with the new courses.

I would also like to see a renewed focus on making our District Championships conform to a high level of competition. In the past, we have had some problems with very short races being sailed, and an attitude of "let's get in races." This is fine for a weekend event, but the District Championship should be of a higher standard. The minimum course lengths prescribed in new rule 34 must be honored.

I think it is also very important to recognize when conditions are not fair for sailing. For Silver and Blue events, we should not race in under 5 knots. This is the minimum that I expect will be adopted for the 2008 Olympics.

The Class Management Committee and International Governing Committee met on March 11. Class financial position remains strong, although we operated at slightly less than break even for 2005. Our 2006 budget again projects expenses to exceed income by about \$15,000. Fortunately, we have some money accumulated from past years that will allow us to pursue new marketing initiatives for 2006. These will be announced later this spring. Of course, the best way to balance the budget is to gain new members and collect dues from all existing members.

Good luck to all for an enjoyable and successful 2006 season. Hope to see you at the major events.

AJ Jakubowska named as alternate to JB

I am very pleased to announce that AJ Jakubowska has accepted the position as alternate on the Class Judiciary Board for 2006. 2006 TOWN HALL MEETING

The second Town Hall meeting at the Bacardi Cup Regatta was called to order by President Bill Allen at poolside on Thursday evening. Bill reviewed many items of interest to Class members, including the Star's position in the Olympics and the recently adopted resolutions. Bill feels that our position is very strong in the Olympics and even if another keelboat was considered we would be very competitive.

There was much discussion about the scoring format for the 2008 Olympics. ISAF has adopted the new Olympic format in response to the request of the TV broadcasting people. The format will only be used in the Olympics and some ISAF grade 1 events. It will not be used in official Star Class events with the possible exception of the 2007 ISAF combined World's.

Mention was made of the upcoming Silver and Gold Star regattas which will provide great venues.

The meeting was then opened to questions from the floor. It seemed most of the people attending are quite happy with the Class. One of the questions which was asked was about the possibility of the weight limit being adjusted. It is felt that the weight limit rule would always be open to a resolution but probably will not change for a while.

Thanks were expressed to Bill for his leadership. Many feel that the return of Starlights and these "Town Hall" open forums go a long way to helping all Class members to be informed of what is happening in the Star Class.

BISCAYNE TROPHY

January 21-22, 2006

The Miami winter season got into high gear with the running the of Biscayne Trophy regatta. Seventy-three boats from around the world showed up for the regatta, which has turned into the tune-up regatta for the Miami OCR in recent years. This is a two-day regatta which uses the traditional three-race, long course format. The regatta was won by Iain Percy and Steve Mitchell. Ross Macdonald and Mike Wolfs came in second and Marc Pickel and Ingo Borkowski finished third in the regatta. The result sheet for the Biscayne Trophy Regatta is given to the right.

MIAMI OCR

January 23-27, 2006

On the day following the Biscayne Trophy 69 Stars from 19 countries participated in the Miami OCR. This year the new Olympic format was tried out at the Miami OCR, with first nine races run with the full fleet, and then the final 10th race run with only the top 10 boats. As shown in the accompanying result sheet, the points were doubled in this final race. Thus, the first place boat received 2 points, the second place boat 4 points, etc.

With the short Olympic courses and such a large fleet there were tight mark roundings and close finishes in almost every race. Huge gains or loses in terms of placings were made at these critical mark roundings. The top three places for each race were spread up and down the fleet, with, for example, one third place finish going to the boat which finished 59th overall, sailed by teenager Tomas Hornos. Only Xavier Rohart and Pascal Rambeau sailed a very consistent series with only one race not in the single digits going into the final day's race. As mentioned above, in this final race only the top 10 boats were allowed to participate. However, since Xavier and Pascal had such a large lead they were able to sit out the final race.

The winner of the event was Xavier Rohart with Pascal Rambeau as crew. Last year's winning team of Andy Horton and Brad Nichol came in second. George Szabo and Eric Monroe rounded out the top three. The results of the Miami OCR are given on the facing page.

THE 2006 ZAG MASTERS

February 11-12, 2006 by Harry Walker

The Zag, as it has been called for a couple of years honoring the memory of Miami Star sailor Frank Zagarino, was sailed out of the Coral Reef Yacht Club on the 11th and 12th of February. Forty-three boats registered and sailed with a great contingent from outside of the United States, thereby adding a true international flavor to what had started as a 7 boat regatta 22 years ago when first dreamed up and proposed by Frank Zagarino. This year not 7 boats but 7 nations were represented headed by last year's Masters Champion Thomas Miller with Marc Pickel up front from Germany. Interestingly there were a number of family units. Fathers and sons included the Danes, Londrigans, Sperrys, Adams, and Richardsons.

The format was to be two races on Saturday and one Sunday. Reliable Rich Raymond, PRO, and the excellent Coral Reef Race committee got us out to the racing area on time in about 5 - 6 miles of breeze and then had to postpone while the breeze went to the south before settling in. The final upwind leg of race one was taken by Canada's Brian Cramer with IGC Chairman Rick Burgess crewing. Magnus Liljedahl, Olympic Gold Medal Crew, sailing with Karl Anderson, skippered the second finisher. John Dane III / John Dane IV, a super fast family, were third.

The breeze had come up to 12 - 14 by the start of the second race. PRO Raymond got this race off under the ZED flag, something that seems to be gaining in popularity in Miami. John Dane took first with the Hicks brothers from England second.

Brian Cramer was third and last years American Yachtsman of the Year Augie Diaz with Olympic hopeful Mark Strube up front came fourth.

The Saturday evening dinner which was hosted by Coral Reef Y.C. It was a great dinner with Chris Rogers winning the ice-cream eating championship.

Sunday morning a strong front moved through at 4 AM and the winds had increased to 25-28 mph and the temperature had dropped about 35 degrees to a very chilly 43. We all sat around eating breakfast, drinking coffee, and wondering if Rich would send us out. After an hours shore postponement the PRO cancelled for the day to the cheers of the assembled sailors.

Trophies were presented in the lobby of the Yacht Club. The Masters' winner was John Dane III with his son John crewing. Runner-up went to Cramer and Burgess and third place to Magnus and Karl Anderson. The Grand Masters Championship was won by 85 year old Harry Walker and Mark Reynolds, with the runners up being Brooks and Austin Sperry. John Vanderhoff and Angelo Buscerni took third place. Exalted Grand Master winner was Veteran Tony Herman with Scott Monroe, with Jack Button with Bear Hovey from Milford Fleet taking 2nd. Dr. Emil Karlovsky and Chris Rogers were 3rd (Emil is 90), although maybe he should be in his own category. Londrigans won the Family trophy. Again we were sorry not to get in the third race but all applauded and thanked the Race Committee and the Club for another great Masters. Old Zag would have loved it!

2006 SOUTH AMERICAN SILVER STAR CHAMPIONSHIP

February 19-22, 2006 Yacht Club of Rio de Janeiro

Twenty-six boats participated at the South American Silver Star Championship. While the majority of the fleet was Brazilian, there were also two boats from Chile, one boat from Argentina and one boat from North America.

This was the first Championship run under the new Star Class rules on race formats. Since there were less than 30 boats Format C was used, allowing the fleet to get in nine races in five days of racing.

Robert Scheidt and Bruno Parda won the Championship. The São Paulo pair won one race, had five seconds, two thirds and a fourth, which was their discard race. Crew Bruno Prada, who is 34 years old and a former Finn sailor, commented. "We had very consistent finishes with the right tactical choices made the majority of the time. To sail in the Rio de Janeiro is complicated because of the force of the currents, but we had an excellent performance."

Robert and Bruno finished with 17 points, followed by 21 points for Alan Adler and Ronaldo Seifert and 32 points for John Albert King and Luiz Carlos Simão. Robert Scheidt, now 32 years old, was very happy with the championship, since Alan and Ronaldo were sailing very well. "We are motivated for the remainder of the season," affirmed Scheidt.

2006 BACARDI CUP March 5-10, 2006

The highlight of the Miami winter sailing season, the Bacardi Cup, lived up to expectations. Ninety-two boats from 22 different countries and four continents showed up for the event.

The Bacardi Cup Regatta continues to be a showcase of what the Star Class is all about. In this regatta there was a cross section of abilities and varieties of sailors, from past World and Olympic champions to Olympic hopefuls to the proverbial weekend warriors. As often noted, in what other sport can you find the elite of that sport and people who participate in the sport for enjoyment competing on the same field? Yet here they all were, all on the same starting line, and from time to time the weekend warriors were able to shine and outdo some of the stars of our sport.

Day 1: Two-time Olympic Gold Medalist and seven-time Bacardi Cup Champion Mark Reynolds, sailing with crew Christian Finnsgard, finished first in day one of sailing Sunday. Seventh after the first mark, Reynolds managed to make consistent gains throughout the race. He made the fourth mark just ahead of Eric Lidecis and attacked the right side on the final run to take the lead. Lidecis chose the left side on all five runs and rounded each mark in the top five, but lost considerable distance to Reynolds on the final run.

Day 2: The father and son-in-law team of John Dane and Austin Sperry won Monday's second race on the waters of Biscayne Bay. With a third place finish in Sunday's first race, this victory gave them the overall lead going into the third race in the regatta.

Day 3: Andy Beadsworth and crew David Carr of Great Britain won Tuesday's race, well ahead of second place finishers Xavier Rohart and crew Pascal Rambeau of France.

Day 4: John Dane and crew Austin Sperry won Wednesday's fourth race. With many of the overall leaders faltering on day four, Dane and Sperry regain the overall lead heading into the final two races of the regatta. Dane and Sperry were among a large group of boats that elected to attack the left side of the course on the first run. Once out in front, Dane and Sperry leveraged strong winds again on the left side to build a commanding 10-boat-length lead at the second mark, substantially ahead of their nearest competitors.

Wednesday night saw the first of the two dinners and award ceremonies for which the Bacardi Cup event has become famous.

Day 5: Two-time Bacardi Cup Champion Peter Bromby, sailing this week with crew Bill McNiven, won Thursday's fifth race.

Day 6: France's Xavier Rohart and crew Pascal Rambeau, the 2005 Star Class world champions and number-one ranked Star team in the world, finished first in the final race of the Bacardi Cup and fourth in the overall standings. The team of John Dane and Austin Sperry came in fourth to clinch the win for the regatta.

The final awards dinner, complete with orchestra and samplings of Bacardi products, was a wonderful ending to a good week of racing.
