NEW YORK STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Seneca Lake Star Fleet is one of the oldest chartered fleets in the Star class having been granted its charter in 1929. This year's New York State Star Championship, which will be sailed on August 11 and 12, will have special meaning, as it will serve as a tune-up for the upcoming 2008 Western Hemisphere Spring Championships May 19-23, 2008.

For those who have not had the pleasure of sailing on this wonderful lake in upstate New York's Finger Lakes region, you must make an effort to attend. The lake is about 3 miles wide and over 40 miles long. Contrary to popular belief, we are not in the mountains, so even when the wind comes from the west, there is still very good sailing.

The Seneca Yacht Club and its members are very excited about hosting its first Silver Star event in 2008 and are working very hard to provide a top-notch regatta both on and off the water. We are located at the north end of the lake near the small city of Geneva, which is also the home of Hobart and William Smith Colleges and their nationally ranked sailing team.

Now I know some are thinking upstate New York in May could be cold. I'm not saying it will be Miami weather, but I think you will be quite pleased.

The Finger Lakes area is well known for the many awardwinning wineries, over 50 within 30 minutes of the club, and a country lifestyle. Right now he is looking for more broken compasses. All successfully repaired units will be sent back to the owners free of charge. For compasses not repairable the owner will be given the option to get the unit back or add to his recycling bin. 10 CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY



Dancing in the Minefield J RULON MILLER SERIES July 7-8, 2007 by Tom Price

Picking your way up to weather out there was treacherous, sometimes exhilarating and sometimes devastating. Each race was won by a different boat and the top boats (except for steady John Manderson) had 1st or 2nd places followed by a plunge down the fleet.

A light, spotty and unusual SE breeze was all we were going to get on Saturday and the RC courageously and competently managed to conduct two challenging races. All 13 Star boats left the line after an hour's wait for the fitful breeze to cover the course. The left side of the course seemed to pay as the breeze trended towards the East, out of the Chester River. Interestingly, the tide ran strongly out of the Chester also, making a flow direction diagonally across the Bay. John Manderson figured it out though, followed by Tom Price and Will Swigart who made late race gains by venturing far left.

The second race started in a more promising breeze from the same quadrant. It proved equally as challenging as it moved from between 150 to 90 degrees and refused to build. Max velocity was about 6 kts. The runs were hot and noisy as the slack rigs shook in the slight motorboat chop. It was a great time to see the speed differences in windward and leeward heel and when to transition. Crews splayed out across the foredecks as if on a "time out" from their skippers. John MacCausland finished in the lead, followed by John

Manderson. Murray Leigh sailed an excellent race to take 3rd place.

Sunday's forecast was for a developing thermal but unfortunately, later in the day. After a 2 hr delay enough wind had filled in to conduct a race. It was a bit east of what usually indicates a sea breeze but we came to play with what we have. Some trusted the right in hopes of the increasing thermal and some played the odds by sticking to the left side that paid off so well on Saturday. On the last beat, the right finally worked as Keith Donald, Henry Filter and Tom Price roared in on the new wind. Both crew on the high side for the first time in the weekend!

As the fleet sailed in with the now delightful southerly, the Stars with their huge twisted mainsails and narrow hulls looked very much like they have looked reaching back to Gibson Island for the best part of a century.

John Manderson was the overall winner, showing consistency with a 1, 2, 4 finish, followed by Keith Donald in 2nd and Henry Filter in 3rd both tied with 14 pts. Tom Price followed closely with 15 pts and John MacCausland with 16 (who fell into the minefield after an excellent first day). Master Trophy winner and Novice winner was Keith Donald, sailing as if he had a lifetime experience in Stars. Keith Donald also won the Blue Chip award for the highest score in Sunday's racing. The tricky conditions made for an interesting if challenging regatta. July is a uniquely "Chesapeake Bay" month to run sailboat races and only Star boats could have had such viable racing in the light conditions.

1ST DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP Cedar Point Y.C.

July 13-15, 2007

Twenty-one boats from 5 of the 6 active 1st District fleets participated in the 1st District Championship, held at Cedar Point Y.C. in Westport, CT. At the request of the organizing committee, Star Class Course Format B was used even though there were less than 30 boats participating.

While 5 races were scheduled, with 2 on Friday and 2 on Saturday, the wind was not wholly cooperative and only 4 races were run.

Two races were run on Friday in relatively light winds out of the southeast. Fotis Boliakis / Mike Nichol sailed most consistently and ended up with a 1,2. The son-and-father team of Tomas and Luis Hornos scored a pair of fours to come in second for the day.

Saturday began in a very light southerly. The first race proved to be a bust, since no one rounded the windward mark before the 40-minute time limit. This was just as well, because shortly thereafter the wind shut down completely. There followed some hours of waiting around, during which there was quite a bit of socializing between the various boats. Carroll McCallum and Trevor Nederlof in particular were more in the water than out and had a good time swimming from boat to boat. When the wind finally did come in a nice course 3 race was run in a southeasterly. However, during the final leg upwind there was a substantial right shift which put some boats nicely ahead and others in the cheap seats. After a difficult first day Ben Cesare and Bjorn Wisecup were able to put it all together to win race 3.

Sunday also began in a fairly light wind, but this time out of the southwest. In fact, the wind was so light that a couple of boats didn't make it to the starting line by the time the race was started. However, luckily for these boats the wind dropped and once again the time limit of 40 minute for making it to the windward mark was exceeded. Again, there was some period of waiting about but finally the promised wind came in. In terms of wind strength the final race proved to be the best of the series, beginning in about 12 knots and ending in about 18. Ched Proctor and Witold Gesing led most of the way and won the race. Fotis Boliakis / Mike Nichol came in 7th which was enough to earn them the Blue Star. The other winners are:




