FIFTH DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

While working on Ed Sprague's forth-coming book, "The San Diego Star Fleet", it became apparent that the early 5th District record of the winners of the 5th District Championship is incorrect. At present the Star Class Log records the following early winners:

Notice that the years 1927, 1931, 1933, 1934 and 1935 are missing. However, research shows that in fact at least for the years 1927 and 1935 the event was sailed.

A review of the early Logs and Starlights shows that while the boat for 1924 is correctly listed, for some reason by the time the first listing of the Winners of Historic Events is given in the 1928 Log the skippers' names between the 1924 winner and the 1925 winner were switched, Schauer for Jessop:

In the 1929 Log Jessop's name for the 1925 event was corrected to Schauer, but Schauer's name remained as the winner of the 1924 event. Then, for some reason in the 1930 Log the entry for 1927 was dropped.

Concerning the 1935 event, various mentions of the upcoming 1935 5th District Championship to be held in San Diego are given in Starlights in 1934 and 1935, but the event itself was not reported, nor was there a report given in the 1936 Log. However, in the 1936 Log there is a the report on the 1935 World's which has the comment that "Whitecap II had recently won the Pacific Coast blue-star series at San Diego." From this remark it appears that Ashley Bown, the skipper of Whitecap II, won the 1935 5th District Blue Star event, and thus should be listed in the Log as such.

The corrected listing of the early winners of the 5th District Blue Star Championship thus should read as follows:

ARMS-WHITE REGATTA June 14-15, 2003

Milford, Connecticut

Twenty-seven Stars from the 10 fleets and two countries of the Tri-District area came together to participate in the Arms-White Regatta. With the weather leading up to the series being absolutely dreadful there was great concern that the regatta would not come off at all. Fortunately dire predictions for the weekend were unfounded and the fleet enjoyed two days of good racing, Long Island Sound style.

This year a new format was tried: a 5 race, no throw-out series with shorter races. It was generally agreed that the 5 race format was successful, but perhaps a throw-out should be allowed.

Saturday started with a nice wind out of the West to Southwest. Race 1, run on a 5 mile course 4, was completed as planned, with Doug and Bob Schofield taking first, Paul Sustronk and Mike Wolfs coming in second, and John Finch with Kevin Murphy coming in third. However, for Race 2 Long Island Sound showed that it can be fickle. Half way up the first leg of a course 4 race the wind quit, then came from the east, and then quit again. The three right-most boats, led by Johnny Finch and Kevin Murphy, got picked up by a nice west wind which carried them to the windward mark well ahead of the rest of the boats. As these three boats neared the finish line the Race Committee mercifully decided to shorten the course to just one round. Finch and Murphy came in first, Marshall Converse with son Reed got second, and David & Alejandra Bolles came in third. The wind held for the rest of the day and Race 3 came off nicely on a 6 mile course 3. Sustronk and Wolfs came in first, John Lombard and Kip Gardner got second, and Finch and Murphy came in third. At the end of the day it seemed like it would be a Canadian sweep.

Sunday dawned with a feeble Northerly and again dire predictions were made that there would be no racing this day. But just about the time the harbor start was due to take place a nice if shifty breeze settled in, again from the West to Southwest, and the two Sunday races were run without a hitch. Race 4, again a 5 miler run on course 4, was won by Doug and Bob Schofield, followed by John MacCausland and Brad Nichol in second and Sustronk and Wolfs in third. Race 5 was again a 6 miler run on course 3 in somewhat shiftier conditions which saw boats gaining and loosing on each leg. MacCausland and Nichol won the race, with Sustronk and Wolfs coming in second and the Schofield brothers coming in third.

The Schofields won the series with an over all score of 18 points, followed by Sustronk and Wolfs with 21 points and MacCausland and Nichol with 29 points. This is the second year in a row that the Schofields have won the regatta

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
Doug Schofield (left) holding the Arms Trophy And Bob Schofield with the White Trophy

ACE, STAR # 202


Ace, Star # 202, was built in 1924 by its one and only owner, Adrian Iselin II. Mr. Iselin and Ace have been probably the most successful combination ever in the Star Class. Aside from winning two World's Championships, once in 1925 and again in 1936, Mr. Iselin won four Silver Stars (1934 and 1935 Spring's; 1935 and 1936 Mid-Winter's), two Blue Stars (1925 and 1945), three Bacardi Cups (1927, 1935 and 1936) and a great number of Long Island Sound regattas.

While Ace is listed as being built by Mr. Iselin, in fact it was built in the work shed of Purdy Boat Co., in which Mr. Iselin had an interest.

In 1925 Adrian Iselin, with Ed Willis as crew, won his first World's Championship. In the advertisement for Ratsey & Lapthorn in the next column we see Ace with the short Marconi rig which was used until the end of 1929. Note that when this picture was taken in 1925 Ace was still using the original backstay arrangement as designed by Francis Sweisguth of just a simple two-to-one block-andtackle. In 1925 Ben Comstock and Bill Gidley installed backstay tracks and slides on their boat Rhody, Star # 143. They won the "Internationals" in 1926, and in true Star Class fashion everyone had to have these new fittings, which at the time were called "Rhody Runners".






Photo: "Forty Years..." Ace with the rig used in the 1930's-1940's

STARDUST

Unlike the other Star in the Mystic collection, Ceti, Star # 7, which was never updated by its owners since it was built by Ike Smith in 1911, the Ace was constantly being updated to keep up with the newest equipment. In fact, in the May 1932 issue of Starlights there is a note saying that "Adrian Iselin's Ace has been almost completely rebuilt during the winter months and little is left of the old 1925 Champion except her keel, but a rejuvenated Ace will be among the starter this season."

Shown in the lower photo in the previous column is Ace in the double spreader era, sometime during the early 1930's. The double spreader rig was the preferred rig for the modern tall mast from 1930 until the mid 1940's. In the Star Class the deck layout has always been left to the preference of the individual skipper. In this photo we see that backstay tracks have been installed on Ace, whereas in the earlier picture of Ace with the short Marconi rig we saw that Mr. Iselin was still using the original backstay arrangement of just a simple two-to-one block-and-tackle.


Another interesting item on Ace after being rebuilt is the rather long chainplate. Whereas in the 1925 photo Ace is shown with a simple strap protruding from the deck the chainplates on the rebuilt Ace appear to be 1 foot or even more in length.

In the above photo is Ardian Iselin II with his Ace near the end of their racing days. As far as can be determined from the records in the Logs, the last year Mr. Iselin raced Ace was in 1952. Boat 2664 to the right of the picture was built in 1947, so this picture was taken in the final five years. Ace has been up-dated and appears to be as well equipped as any of the newer boats. Note that the boats in this picture, including Ace, had all gone to the single spreader rig by this time. However, from time to time people would try out the double spreader rig, one of the last examples probably being Harry Nye's Gale which appeared in the cover of the 1960 Log.

After his death in July, 1961, both his boat Ace and many of the trophies won by Mr. Iselin and Ace were given to Mystic Seaport Museum. Ace is now on display in the collection of small boats at Mystic.
