ARMS-WHITE REGATTA

Arms Trophy To Winning Skipper White Trophy To Winning Crew June 17 – 18, 2006

The Arms-White series is named after two sailors from the C.L.I.S. fleet, John Taylor Arms and Elwood S. White. In 1937 John Arms donated the Arms Trophy and in 1942 the family of Elwood White donated the White Trophy for the winning crew of the Arms series. The series, originally called the Noroton Race Week, was sailed out of the C.L.I.S. until 1969, and then was relocated to Mid-Conn in 1970.

The Arms-White Regatta has enjoyed a good turnout over the years and recently has been running between 20 to 35 boats. Always a nice feature is the Saturday evening dinner at Milford Yacht Club. We are please to announced we have secured the "world famous" Mystic Jammers (reggae band) for Saturday evening.

2006 MID CLINIC

Run by John MacCausland

There will be two clinics held on Friday, June 16: a morning clinic starting at 10 am for those who have their boats already set up at Milford Yacht Club, and an afternoon clinic starting at 1:30 pm for those who arrive on Friday morning. The topics to be covered in the clinics are:

- 1) what's new
- 2) mast types and characteristics (any clear choices?)

- 3) technical information about flying the jib a couple of feet off the deck on the run
- 4) foil shapes, especially that of having a rounded leading edge versus a sharp leading edge on the keel
- 5) type of bottom finish
- 6) sail trim for different conditions (flat water, lumpy seas, light wind, big breeze, etc)
- 7) steering technique waves vs. flat, with on the water analysis
- 8) amount of rake downwind
- 9) advantage of having shroud levers
- 10) spend a few minutes on each boat evaluating set-up, trim, steering technique, gear shifting, basic boat handling, mark roundings etc.
- 11) wrap-up



MID-CONN MEMORIAL DAY SERIES

Saturday dawn with a heavy fog and a light wind. However, by noon the fog began to burn off and the fleet drifted out to the starting line. Five of the 10 boats were still quite a ways off by 1:30 and it was decided to run a quick practice race while waiting for the rest of the boats to arrive. By the time those who were racing got back to the starting line it was already late in the day so another short practice race was held. Neither race counted towards the series.

On Sunday two races were held. The wind was a bit stronger, about 5 knots. Race 1 got off well and the course was completed in about 1 hour. Race 2 was rather confusing. Before the race one course was posted and then just at the warning sound the course was changed. One of the boats did not notice the change of course and sailed to the wrong windward mark. It is unknown why the other DNF's sailed off with this boat, because after the race they all said that they saw the change of course. Anyway, only three boats went to the right mark to start with, and the most of others tried to finish the race by also sailing off to the correct windward mark after seeing that they had sailed to the wrong mark. However, by the time they got down to the leeward mark the wind had died completely and only the first three boats made it around the mark and were able to finish the race. The rest drifted away from the leeward mark carried by the tide and never could get around it. The one uninformed boat, after having rounded the wrong mark, didn't even try to round the correct windward mark and just sailed in after sailing by the committee boat to ask them what was the correct course, since they could see that all the other boats, including the ones who were out with them, sailed off to round the other mark. When they were told about the change of course they said to themselves "oh well" and sailed in.

On Monday the final race of the series was held. The winds again were very light, so it took 2 hours to cover the 5 mile course. The upwind leg was run in slack tide so there was no problem getting to the windward mark. However, by the time the boats made it to the leeward mark there was a substantial amount of current as was the case the day before. Only one boat decided to approach the mark from the up-tide side while the rest found themselves fighting the tide to try to round the mark. Also, again the wind shut down for a while. This strung out the fleet, since as soon as a boat could round the mark they were able to take off beating against what little wind there was. The three lead boats did round fairly close to each other and kept in a tight group to the finish line, which made for interesting racing for them during the last beat.

Jack Button with Pat Valleau as crew won the weekend.

CENTRAL LONG ISLAND MEMORIAL DAY SERIES

The Cedar Point YC Memorial Day Series Races are the start of the Central Long Island Star Fleet's Jane Lawrence Series which is the fleet qualification series for the Star Worlds. Five races are scheduled for the three day Memorial Day weekend, six more races are scheduled for Saturdays in June and five races are scheduled for the Fourth of July weekend, making a possible total of sixteen races in the qualification series. The 2005 Jane Lawrence winner was Fotis Boliakis and he seems to be intent on winning again this year along with the right to represent the fleet at the 2006 Worlds in San Francisco. However, we will not complete sixteen races.

On Saturday, May 27, five Stars sailed in a light breeze to the one o'clock warning gun, only to have the breeze fade and race canceled. Sunday, after a postponement, enough wind

filled in for a start, but the race became a test of patience. Guy Gurney triumphed with Dave Perry second in a fleet of six boats.

Sunday Perry knew whom he wanted to beat and essentially match raced with Gurney, burying him at the start. He then attacked Carroll McCallum who had been standing in third and having buried her, chased after Fotis, who was able to hold first place to the finish.

CLIS fleet is very pleased to have the aggressive participation of Dave Perry, sailing with his son, Alex. We were also happy to have a new fleet member, Ryan Storkman, able to use one of the fleet boats. Ryan recently moved to New York City from Seattle where he sailed Thunderbirds. His crew was Trevor Nederlof, a high school senior from Westport, CT, also new to the Star class.

2006 SPRING STAR REGATTA

Mid Eastern Shore Fleet, Second District Miles River Yacht Club, St. Michaels, MD May 6-7, 2006 By Carroll Beek

I can think of no nicer sight, after driving four hours down the turnpike, another hour through the farmlands of Eastern Maryland, slowing down to get through St. Michaels, then to turn around a last corner and come upon a pasture of Star boats. With rigs up, thirty or so boats wait in the green grass, their white bows in a straight line. Wednesday night races regularly get fifteen of these boats on the water. Sail maker

John Jenkins is leading the Wednesday series so far this spring.

Only five locals sailed out to join the nine boats that arrived and set up their rigs in the pasture for the 2006 Spring Star Regatta on the weekend of May 8-9. All of the visitors were Second District sailors with the exception of myself from the First District, and my crew, a new associate member of the Central Long Island Star Fleet, Ryan Storkman, recently from Seattle. Ryan and I drove south to the Eastern Shore after work on Friday, arriving well before midnight on Tilghman Island, where Sam Hopkins generously offered us housing.

There is much to be said for Miles River regattas. The hospitality of the Eastern Shore inhabitants is matched by the beauty of their countryside and shores. The race course this year was the stretch of river just downwind from the yacht club, a quick sail out to the start, and the race committee was efficient as always. The entry fee of \$35 covered coffee and donuts in the morning and included on-the-water delivery of bagged lunches between races on Saturday.

Though there was wind forecast and wind before and after the races, it was mostly a light air regatta. We had five races and good opportunities to practice tactics. John MacCausland usually led the way, and as usual was generous in explaining why he'd gone one way or the other. Henry Filter, fresh from winning the NOOD in Annapolis, won a race on Saturday but

couldn't sail on Sunday and left MacCausland to dominate and win

We battled with locals Karen Alt and her father, Chuck Wiley, and Dan North, and did best in the last race when excellent tactical calls by Ryan allowed us to nip ahead of Barbara Vosbury and Matt Beck in a drifting finish.

Saturday night Ryan and I took the opportunity to drive the 40 minutes across the Bay Bridge to Annapolis to see the Volvo boats on display, and visit the US Sailing pavilion where there were photographs of all the famous sailors of recent history, the majority of which were easily identified as once and always Star sailors.

2006 LIPPINCOTT MEMORIAL REGATTA

Annapolis Yacht Club, Annapolis, MD May 20-21, 2006

As a preface to the Spring Championship, the Howard Lippincott Memorial Regatta had a long entry list, 35 boats this year, though the windy conditions kept some of the teams ashore to preserve their gear for the Championship the following week. Saturday morning the wind was moderate sailing out but as the wind built and around into the Northwest, the race committee moved the starting line out nearly into the shipping channel. Showing that they were fast in cold water as well as warm, recent Bacardi Cup winners John Dane and Austin Sperry won the first race but then quit sailing and went in out of the gusts that were coming down the river at 25 knots. Master Australian Iain Murray won the

second race on Saturday and came back out on an even windier Sunday to capture the regatta win.

Second District native John MacCausland totaled eight points behind Iain Murray for second in the regatta. Only one point behind MacCausland, Karl Anderson of Boston Harbor was third. Anderson, with Magnus Liljedahl crewing, won the race on Sunday, a fast windy race that finished in the teeth of the wind at the mouth of the Severn. Sunday's race was also good for 12th District representative John Chiarella, who finished third.

Everyone had a short sail in and a long afternoon to enjoy the sunshine on shore and repair and prepare for the Spring Championship the week ahead. Annapolis Yacht Club provided both a pleasant Saturday dinner on the terrace and buffet after the trophy presentation on Sunday as well as an ever diligent and expert race committee.
