In accordance with Rule 16.1 the IGC has elected to change the site and date of the 2007 Annual Meeting to September 8, 2007, at the site of the 2007 European Championships in Lake Garda, Italy.

#### SUMMARY OF ISAF MID-YEAR MEETING

The mid year meeting of ISAF was held in Paris May 4-6, 2007. The mid year meeting normally addresses any urgent issues that come up in international sailing between annual meetings, held in November each year. There are also some routine items that come up for discussion. I attended with Hal Haenel, a member of the ISAF events committee.

#### **Olympic Events selection**

The ISAF regulations require specifically that a short list of possible Olympic events be developed by Council at the mid year meeting 5 years prior to the Olympic Games. The events are defined as the type of boat to be sailed, not the specific class. For example, the Star is the Men's keelboat. There are currently (2008) 11 Olympic events in sailing. The final choice of 2012 Olympic events will be made at the annual meeting in Portugal November 3-12, 2007.

The specific classes for competition will be chosen at the annual meeting in 2008, after the 2008 Olympic Games.

After much discussion in the meetings, the ISAF council basically adopted the events for 2008 as the basis for a short

list for 2012; added to this list was a women's multi-hull, a women's high performance dinghy, and the possibility that keelboats will be either match racing or fleet racing. Basically, the possibilities are pretty all inclusive. In addition, new submissions may be made for other events prior to the fall meeting.

The IOC has told ISAF that the events for 2012 will be reduced from 11 to 10, so one event must be eliminated. They want the Olympics to represent either events where a large number of countries can participate, or events that show the excitement and athleticism of sailing. Only the Laser and Boards can attract the 60-70 countries that are desired, but the Star as an exciting and athletic boat.

There has been some testing of women's skiffs, possibly to replace the Yngling or even the 470. There is the possibility that keelboats will be eliminated altogether. My feeling at this point is that keelboats will remain in for 2012, at least for men. If keelboats are in for women, it is likely to be in match racing. Hopefully the men would remain fleet racing.

At this point, I feel that the critical thing will be to keep keelboat fleet racing in the Olympics. If keelboats are included, it is likely that the Star will remain in. But cutting the number to 10 raises many possible scenarios. ISAF currently plans to have 6 men's events (although the multi-hull is technically OPEN) and 4 women's events, but there is great interest in achieving a 5-5 balance. There is also some interest in "balancing" the men's and women's events. i.e. 2 single handed, 2 double, 2 boards, 2 skiffs, 2 keelboats, 2 multi-hulls, etc. Obviously that is too many so something must go.

The Star is planning a campaign to show what an exciting and athletic boat it is, and one that is sailed by the majority of recognized sailing names.

There are basically 3 reasons why keelboats should remain in the Olympic Games:

- 1. Keelboats represent 70% of participation in the sport of sailing and should be represented.
- 2. Keelboats provide an opportunity for larger people (over 95 Kg) to compete in the Olympics in other than single handed events. ISAF would like the events to represent different body sizes and "physiques".
- 3. Most important ISAF wants to increase TV and Internet media interest. We never do well in TV attention, but sailing was the 5th most hit internet sport at Athens. For this to be successful we need to have stories of heroes in the sport; past medalists, America's Cup / Volvo sailors; the recognizable names in sailing. Most of these people would come from keelboats.

We will be developing some data regarding the media attention at past events. Then we can put together a package both for sponsors, and for the ISAF meeting in November.

Claude Bonanni and John Chiarella will be coordinating this effort

Other items of interest at the meeting:

\*The World Cup concept was discussed as well, with no further specific plans. The ISAF grade one events, (MOCR, Melbourne, Hyeres, Princess Sophia, Holland and Kiel) and class World Championships will be scored to crown a World Cup Champion. In future years, (2009 or 2010) a World Cup final event may be held in September or October. Details of scoring, eligibility etc. have not been developed.

\*ISAF has approved Fried Elliott and Lynn Fitzpatrick to cover the 2007 combined worlds for the class. Fried and Lynn will be our PR team at the World's, and they can help develop the materials we will need for class promotion (for sponsors and ISAF presentation).

With all the attention on the ISAF Worlds Championship and Olympic status, let's not forget that it's the fleet and local racing that makes our class the best. This summer is a good chance to focus on local racing, and perhaps the North Americans and Europeans, both in beautiful venues. I hope to see many of you at both events.

## **EXPERT OLYMPIC GARDA 2007**

March 14-18, 2007 North Lake Garda Report by Laura Gastaldelli

Results for ten races of the Eurolymp being sailed at Fraglia Vela Malcesine, North Lake Garda, Italy. One race was on March 14, four races were sailed March 15, three more races were sailed March 16, and one on March 17. The final, medal race was March 18. On a couple of days racing started at 8 am. Some very long days on the water...

On Day Three of racing the 3 races were divided into two in the morning with good local northern wind, called "pelér", of intensity of 6/7 m.s. and one race in the afternoon with southern local wind (named "òra"). Unfortunately the wind in the afternoon was not as strong as usual (only 3/4 m.s.) but was enough to finish the race.

On Day Four, unfortunately, the wind was very light so only one race was sailed. Even with the first place of Peer Wilhelm / Nils Hollweg in race 9 nothing relevant changed for the first ten sailors qualified for the medal race, except for Marin Lovrovic / Sinisa Mikulic who moved up to 9th at Datsenko / Yevseyenko's cost.

On Day Five, the single medal race was sailed with very light wind for the top ten sailors and as expected the regatta winner is Hamish Pepper / Brad Nichol. For second place Alberto Barovier / Nando Colaninno finished ahead of Diego Negri / Luigi Viale, and 4th place went to Lake Garda's crew Silvio Santoni / Sergio Lambertenghi of Circolo Vela Torbole.

Thanks to all the competitors and we hope to you at Fraglia Vela Malcesine for the Star European Championship 2007 (from 7th to 14th September 2007).

#### 2007 SOUTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIP

March 19-25, 2007 Yacht Club Argentino Mar del Plata, Argentina based on the report by J. Cabot

Seventeen boat, representing Argentina, Brazil, Chile and the U.S. signed up for the 2007 South American Silver Star Championship held at the Yacht Club Argentino, Mar del Plata, Argentina. The schedule was to run 7 races in 4 days over a 5-legged windward – leeward course.

Wednesday, March 21, race 1 & 2: With the wind out of the northeast starting at about 14 knots and diminishing to 10 knots two good races were sailed on the first day of the regatta. Alessandro Pascolatto with Henry Boening were winners of race 1, and Gastao Brun / Marco Lagoa won race 2. There was an unfortunate collision in the first race at the windward mark in which Carlos Rivero / Sergio Bonelli holed Alberto Zanetti / Gustavo Warburg on the port side. Rivero dropped out of the race and Zanetti had to retire as well.

**Thursday, March 22, race 3:** After a late start only one race was run in a Southeasterly breeze. Guillermo Calegari / Federiro Calegari won race 3.

Friday, March 23, races 4 & 5: With the wind blowing out of the east-southeast at about 18 to 20 knots, with puffs to 24, there were various breakdowns and in each race only 7 boats were able to finish. Gastao Brun / Marco Lagoa won both races. In the evening The Yacht Club held the mid-week awards ceremony and dinner on the beach in front of the Yacht Club. The club's Commodore handed out the various awards, and the Star Class presented the Club with a mounted silver half model in recognition for the Club hosting the event.

**Saturday, March 24, race 6:** After a postponement due to the lack of wind, race 6 got of at 1:30. The wind was out of the east-northeast at 7 to 8 knots. Only one race could be run. Once again, Gastao Brun / Marco Lagoa won the race and with this won the event to become the new Champions of South American Silver Star Championship.

#### TROFEO PRINCESA SOFIA

April 1-6, 2007 Palma de Majorca Based on reports by Brad Nichol

The schedule was to sail two races a day from Sunday through Thursday and then the top 10 boats sailed a "Medal Race" on Friday.

Sunday, Day One, Races 1 & 2: Day one saw light and shifty conditions out on the water and many classes did not even get a race started. The Stars were the largest class of boats competing so their course was the furthest out to sea and they actually got a nice sea breeze. Hamish Pepper / Brad Nichol succeed in keeping their boat going to finish first. In the second race the wind picked up. Robert Scheidt won the day with a 2, 2, followed by Pepper / Nichol with a 1, 5 and Mateusz Kusznierewic / Tomasz Holc with a 6, 1.

Monday, Day Two, Races 3 & 4: The course for the first race was considerably longer then the previous day's courses with the weather mark just out of sight. The race was won by Lars Kiewning / Niels Hentschel followed by Pepper / Nichol. Just before the second start of the day the wind built enough to churn up some white caps. However, the second run brought the fleet together as the wind diminished down the run. The leeward mark caused quite a traffic jam and a nice game of bumper boats ensued with entirely too few protest flags. We escaped with only three boats running into us. The race was won by Marc Pickel / Ingo Borkowski with Xavier Rohart / Pascal Rambeau coming in second.

**Tuesday, Day Three, Races 5 & 6:** At the start of the first race of the day several boats were caught off guard. Xavier Rohart did not even have his main sail up when the race started and five other boats started late. With this race Robert Scheidt and Bruno Prada began their record of 5 consecutive

firsts. For the second race saw Mateusz Kusznierewic / Tomasz Holc moved from 7th to first with a 2, 2 on the day and Robert Scheidt / Bruno Prada showed incredible down wind speed winning both races and moving into second.

Wednesday, Day Four, Races 7 & 8: It is always interesting to see how different teams deal with the Olympic Quadrenniam schedule when planning their campaign. We are now 15 months from the Olympics at a venue known for good sailing conditions with good competition. We have two grade 1 events back to back with five days in between. Most of the Olympic front-runners are here in Palma with new equipment, some aren't even racing the first event so they can work out the kinks. If you look closely at the pictures, many sails don't have company logos, and rather than just Lillia and Folli, there are six different boat builders represented in the fleet.

With all that is going on there is one thing for sure, Robert Scheidt / Bruno Prada are fast. They won both races again today in very tricky conditions. Marc Pickel / Ingo Borkowski moved into second place.

Thursday, Day Five, Race 9: In the only race of the day we had one general recall and a start that should have been a general. With one minute and thirty seconds to go the fleet was lined-up right at the line and a micro puff blew down the line and all the boats lurched forward a length. The boats around us trimmed on at 20 to go and we went with them. We were a good three or four boat lengths over when the gun went off and there was only 1 boat called over. This has been the case all week with the Finn class and really makes for bad racing. Robert Scheidt / Bruno Prada won their fifth race in a row to lock up the victory as long as they take their victory lap and finish last or better in tomorrow's medal race.

**Friday, Day Six, the Medal Race:** Robert Scheidt and Bruno Prada did what was required of them and won the event.

## 2007 WESTERN HEMISPHERE CHAMPIONSHIP

March 31-April 6, 2007 Tampa Bay Based on report by Lynn Fitzpatrick

Day One – Races 1 & 2: The Wind goes right on Tampa Bay: Davis Island Yacht Club not only has an impressive view of Tampa Bay, the starts can take place within a couple of hundred yards off the club's shore. The Davis Island Race Committee turned on the wind switch at exactly 2:57 pm and transformed Tampa Bay from a glassy mirage fit for water skiing to a sailing arena very similar to San Diego's Mission Bay. It's no surprise that George Szabo and Andrew Scott read the wind and the water conditions like tea leaves and rounded the first weather mark in front of Rohan Lord / Miles Addy, Iain Murray / Andrew Palfrey / Brian Kramer / Tyler Bjorn. While George and Andrew extended their lead, the pack of 6-7

boats behind them remained tight all the way down the run and there was at least one pile up around the leeward mark.

The wind shifted right throughout the second race of the day. Freddie Lööf and Anders Ekström port tacked most of the fleet from the pin to lead around the first weather mark and hold the lead all of the way to the finish. As Larry Scott said, following his and Jock Kohlhas' comeback from 13th at the final leeward mark to second at the finish, "we went just where we were supposed to go. The wind went right as the sun started to set, and we followed it."

## Day Two – Race 3: Is your heart rate up?

There's no better feeling than being on the inside of a shift at the top of a leg. By the same token, your heart sinks when you're caught on the outside. Peter Bromby and Bill McNiven and Eivind Melleby / Petter Pederson executed picture perfect starboard tack starts at the pin, tacked, crossed everyone on

their hip and clearly had the lead off the line. As they reached the middle of the course, a huge left shift came through with Peter and Bill on the inside sailing 60-70 degrees higher on port tack than everyone to their right.

The highlight of the regatta was watching Freddy Lööf / Anders Ekström engage Andy Macdonald / Mike Wolfs in a tacking duel during the last beat. Andy and Freddy spent a lot of time training together prior to the 2004 Olympic trials. Despite sailing their first regatta together, Andy and Mike took on the challenge and most importantly never lost sight of the layline to the finish. After nearly two dozen tacks, Freddy and Anders threw one last tack to the right and Andy and Mike headed off on starboard in a full hike to take the gun. John MacCausland / Bob Schofield sailed up the left side of the course to finish third.

Freddy Lööf, over twenty years younger than Andy Macdonald, admitted to Andy that he had gotten a workout during the tacking duel when he smiled and asked his friend, "Is your heart rate up?"

#### Day Three - Races 4, 5 & 6: Bromby and the Beat

For the third day in a row sailors arrived at Davis Island Yacht Club to find a glassy Tampa Bay. Races were postponed on shore until there was a sign of breeze. Wind readings on the race committee boat and the on the weather mark boat varied enough so that it took a long time for the race committee to reach agreement and set the weather mark at 285 degrees.

Peter Bromby and Bill McNiven had three of their signature starts from the pin end of the line. They read the shifts and the pressure and rounded the first weather mark in each of today's three races in the lead. They may very well have won all three races had it not been for a fouled jib halyard that distracted them and let their competition get to their right after the final leeward mark rounding of the second race. The Bermudians allowed eleven boats to pass them up the final beat. They finished the day with a 1, 12, 1.

Peter and Bill seem to have perfected sailing in flat water and shifty conditions. "It bears a striking resemblance to Hamilton Harbor. I'm used to trimming hard, keeping the boat flat and pointing a little higher than most. It's when the wind comes on and there are a lot of waves when I start to have some problems", admitted Peter. Freddy Lööf who had a 2, 5, 2 for the day, said today's sailing conditions were "very tricky and shifty." The wind, "was very hard to predict. It was tough out there, but it was a great day of sailing."

## Day Four - No Wind:

The Race Committee tried to get off a race but the wind did not cooperate.

The 2007 Star Western Hemisphere Championship ended with former World Champions Freddy Lööf and Anders Ekström claiming the Silver Star with 11 points. Peter Bromby and Bill Mc Niven were second with 21 points. Iain Murray and Andrew Palfrey were third. Rohan Lord and Miles Addy were fourth and Andy Macdonald and Mike Wolfs were fifth. Only four points separated the second place finishers from the fifth place finishers.

Davis Island Yacht Club pulled out all of the stops on the water and on shore for the Star Class. By using Format C, which provided for short courses, they took into account almost everything – except that sometimes no matter what you do the wind won't cooperate.

#### 2007 EASTERN HEMISPHERE CHAMPIONSHIP

April 10-17, 2007 Club Náutic S'Arenal Mallorca, Spain Based on reporta by Brad Nichol

**Day One** – After the first scheduled day of racing 54 boats were tied for first as we sat in the cafe all day.

Day Two, Races 1 & 2: Cold and wet does not even begin to describe how miserable the conditions were today. The forecast was for winds out of the north around 20 knots with rain and squalls all day. When we got to the start line for the first race the wind shut off and we sat there for an hour with the rain soaking through our layers. After a couple of delays the wind settled down enough to race. The race winners were Luca Modena and Michele Marchesini.

During the second race there were at times 20 knots of winds. Robert Scheidt and Bruno Prada got the first of two firsts.

Day 3, Races 3-4: The wind finally came to Palma after two weeks of light air sailing but the clouds and rain hung around. A few times today this bright yellow sphere appeared in the sky, but disappeared as quickly as it came. Today we raced triangle courses with reaching legs, which are fast and fun when it is windy. For the second race the wind picked up to a solid 22 knots. We had a good battle with Robert Scheidt / Bruno Prada and

Xavier Rohart / Pascal Rambeau up the first leg and made it to the weather mark in first. On the first reach Scheidt caught us quickly and passed us to leeward and Rohart snuck in at the jibe mark. On the second reach we battled with Rohart / Rambeau. Meanwhile Scheidt / Prada slipped away into the distance to win the race.

**Day 4, Race 5:** The first attempt at a race was aborted after two legs when the wind shut off completely. A light sea breeze filled in an hour later and we tried again in the opposite wind direction.

After finishing the Princess Sofia regatta with five bullets Robert Scheidt and Bruno Prada followed it up with another great regatta locking up the Spring Championships of the Eastern Hemisphere with one race to spare. Today in very light conditions they rounded the first mark in 22nd and were 12th by the leeward mark and then rounded the 3rd mark in 10th and were in 2nd by the leeward mark. The race was won by Robert Stanjek and Carsten Witt.

**Day 5, Race 6:** Before last race of the regatta four points separated second though sixth place. The battle for second and third was between these five boats.

The race was sailed in difficult conditions and single digit finishes went far down through the fleet. The races was won by Leonidas Elekanakis and George Stilianos.

The event was won by Robert Scheidt / Bruno Prada. Mateusz Kusznierewicz / Dominik Zycki came in second and Diego Negri / Luigi Viale came in third.
