## NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIP TO ADAMS AND RICHARDS

Thompson R. Adams of Wilmette Harbor, long an active Star sailor in the Chicago area but never before a major series winner, won the 1973 North American Championship at Gibson Island, Maryland, in a fleet of 37. Adams and his old faithful crew Bill Richards pulled off something of a magician's trick by snatching the victory from their two closest competitors by one point in a series whose outcome was in doubt until the last leg of the last race. Tied for second were past World's Champion and gold medalist Durward Knowles, and young Jimmie Lippincott who has steadily been moving into prominence in recent seasons.

The series was blessed with better than usual Chesapeake Bay weather: no calms, no cancellations, not even any postponements. There was enough wind, mostly from the northern half of the compass, for at least some hiking on every weather leg. There were major shifts, to be sure, and twice the windward mark was moved between rounds to guarantee a windward leg the next time up. Perhaps this was reflected in the fact that the winning boat averaged only fifth in daily placings. Adams' and Richards' 3-10-8-1-4 was better than anyone else was able to produce. Observers said they simply outsmarted the competition. The daily firsts went to four different boats, Knowles' *Gem* being the only double winner, and the series lead changed after every race but one.

All boats were measured by a very able committee headed by Sam Hall, who even ruled that he had to alter his own rudder to allow himself to enter the series.

Durward Knowles of Nassau, with Monte Higgs crewing, won the opening race convincingly in a steady northeaster. They had

also taken the tune-up race, and Knowles, whom the local newspaper called "the most decorated skipper," was certainly the favorite at this point. Charlie Morgan of St. Petersburg, Florida, the defender, was second; and Jimmie Lippincott approached the finish line third, but Adams passed him just before they reached the line. That little switch was one of many moves that decided the series, but no one knew it then.

In the second race a northwest front that hit the fleet in the middle of the race, accompanied by a thirty degree windshift, of course shook up the order, and Adams was one of those who suffered. Frank Zagarino got the nod at the finish, overlapped with both Dave Oberg, second in last year's Toronto event, and Morgan. The third race was another close one in a dying breeze as Lippincott, Basil Kelly and Oberg seesawed toward the finish line, crossing it in that order. All boats were hauled that night for the rest day that followed.

Meanwhile where was Tom Adams in the score? "Not looking so good," was the answer. The first seven boats at this stage lined up as follows:

encouraging prospect, but it did not discourage Adams and Richards. On the lightest day of all and in shifty breezes, they found all the right answers to win the fourth race by over two minutes. Charlie Morgan touched another boat when in about 18th place and withdrew. When the smoke cleared away, Jim Lippincott emerged as the leader by 6 points over Adams, with Knowles 4 points farther back. But the series was not over yet.

In the only southerly of the week, Durward Knowles found the 20-25 knot breeze to his liking and led at every mark to win by more than a minute. To beat Knowles in the series, Adams must now finish fourth or better. He finished fourth. Then what about Lippincott? He must finish tenth or worse, and he finished eleventh, with a broken barney post and mainsheet cleat.

Col. Jack Streeton chaired the race committee, except for one day when Bill Boykin substituted. That there was not one protest spoke well for the committee work and the calibre of the racing fleet. Dave Gaillard's entertainment committee provided social events every evening, plus a keg of cold beer upon arrival on shore after each race, a popular feature. The day after the series, "See you in San Diego next month!" was the farewell word from many skippers who were about to start the long trek to the World's.

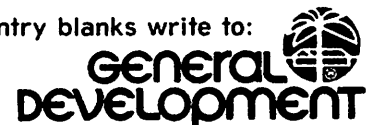

1973 TWELFTH DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS

As has been customary for some years, the 12th District Blue and Green Star championships were sailed together, this time on northern Lake George, with the usual big fleets participating. The 1973 Blue Star was won by District Secretary Tom Linville and crew Mark Brown of the Southern Lake George Fleet, by virtue of tying Bill and Fred Watson from Lake Ontario on points but beating them in the first two races. Third was taken by Brud Nicholson and Bob Sweitzer of Ithaca. Pre-regatta favorite Hank Rowan withdrew from the middle race but proved out with a first and a second in the other two.

The Green Star was won by Alden Bryan and Roy Neuer of the Champlain Fleet in another tie-breaker, over Dave Stephenson and Bill Lober of Cayuga Lake, with Fred and Linda Heine from Greenwood Lake finishing third.

The first race started in moderate southerly winds which disappeared into light and variable for the last round of the Course 2 circuit. Meislahn and Rowan of the host fleet welcomed the visitors by moving into an early lead, which they lost to Nicholson when the wind died. Rowan recovered just at the end, to win in a seven boat overlap on the finish line. In the second race the wind held up throughout. Russ Bogie and Linville led at every mark after staying on the initially favored port tack longer than the rest of the fleet. Watson jumped out of the pack to a solid third; but Marshall was fourth, moving him into series lead by one point over Linville, with Nicholson one more point back.

The committee decided to start the last race very early in the day to avoid a washout similar to the first race. The wind was again good, with one side of the course heavily favored - only this time it was the other side. This fooled many skippers, but not Watson, who hit it just right to move into a strong lead followed by Pike Sullivan, Linville and Rowan. Linville managed

to get into second at the top of the second beat, but Millar passed him on the run, and on the last windward leg Rowan passed them both for second. Near the finish Rowan closed on Watson, but the leader was not to be denied. Millar took third as Linville just nosed out Sullivan for fourth to save his series win.

Racing for the Green was equally close with five boats in contention after two races. Bryan sailed a consistent 3-5-4 to win the third race finish to give Bryan the one more point he


needed. Smith had a second in the opening race, and would have been in serious contention had he not fouled out in the second.

Northern Lake George Yacht Club ran a good regatta, with Howard Lippincott on hand as honorary race committee chairman for the first two races. The social events were capped by an evening dinner cruise around ever-spectacular Lake George. The regatta goes to the winner's southern end of the lake next year, for the first time.

Not satisfied with having won a Green Star earlier in the season, Bob Webster, with co-owner Skip Smith crewing, put together a consistent 2-5-2 to win the Blue Star of the First District over the former World's Championship combination of Joe Duplin and Fran Dolan.

Third place went to Joe Zambella and Leo Dawson, to give a series sweep to the Boston Harbor boats.

The racing was conducted in light to medium air on Broad Sound, the site of the 1964 World's, and all three races were notable for good starting lines and courses. Two other attempts were cancelled when major wind shifts occurred shortly after the start, changing initial windward legs into what would have been reaches or runs.

The winning boat has the unusual record of having been entered in a total of six district championships and having won five of those, 3 Blues and 2 Greens.
